The first day of school will be on August 23rd. I know our staff will be ready to welcome students back into the buildings. Until then, take some time to relax and enjoy all that summer has to offer. I am going to keep working hard to keep moving things forward to make Colo-NESCO the best school it can be. 
The hayrack has been rebuilt and used in the Colo Crossroad festival parade and will be used in the Zearing Days Parade this year as well.

## YSS Kid's Club Set to Open at Colo-NESCO --- from Marc Snavely

The Colo-NESCO Community School District has partnered with YSS and the Ames Chamber of Commerce to start a Before/After School Kid's Club in Colo starting on Wednesday, August 23rd, which is the first day of school. The Kid's Club will operate from 6:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m. on a daily basis. Pending enrollment numbers, we also plan to have the Kid's Club open on days where we don't have school. Families have already started to enroll. Please refer to our website to enroll. I have placed a red banner on the front page of the website so this is easily accessible. All enrollment information is posted there.

Please mark your calendars for Tuesday, August 1st. We plan to have a ribbon cutting from 4:30 p.m.-6:30 p.m. that night. We will also be running an in-person registration that evening. YSS will be on-site and will be doing some fun activities for the kids as parents fill out enrollment forms. Snacks will be served. You are all welcome to attend. The Kid's Club will be operating out of the two classrooms directly to your left if you come down the ramp from the Colo Front Entrance by the main office. Once we open on August 23rd, parents will pick up/drop off kids at the entrance north of the building that goes directly to these classrooms. We added a camera and buzz-in system to also make this entrance secure exactly like our front entrance.

I wanted to give you a little history on how the Kid's Club started. Throughout the 2022-2023 School Year, a Childcare Task Force was assembled to help explore opening this Before/After School Program for students in grades K-6 and ultimately forming a plan to make this happen. Colo was chosen as the site since daycare options are scarce in Colo. It was also noted as we studied this that Colo is considered a Daycare Desert in Iowa. We believe the northern part of the Colo-NESCO Community School District does have some private daycare options and the Bethany Lutheran Church in McCallsburg leases space from the school and operates their private daycare there as well. The Kid's Club is not intended to be in competition with anyone doing childcare. The childcare need is there, and we want to make sure students have a safe place to go before and after school and on days where there may not be school due to a professional development day, winter break, spring break, etc. In partnership with YSS and the Ames Chamber of Commerce, several grants were written and enough funds were secured to bring this to fruition. This site will be licensed through the Department of Human Resources (DHS), and in collaboration with the school, will be run by YSS.

# Coach Brandon Frohwein 2022-23 Season

The Colo-Nesco baseball team finished the season with a 11-14 record including an 8-7 conference record which was good enough for a tie for 2nd place in the Iowa Star South.

The season started off with three convincing wins over Clarion-Goldfield-Dows, Melcher-Dallas, and BCLUW. Spencer Hansen had 15 strikeouts vs CGD and Drew Banks followed that with 10 strikeouts vs Melcher-Dallas. After three tough losses, the Royals rebounded with back to back wins over North Tama and GMG.

North Tama was a slugfest as the Royals outlasted the Redhawks 17-11. Banks provided a strong pitching performance in a win of GMG. The Royals went through a stretch with some tough injuries but were able to pull out wins over Riceville and Belmond-Klemme, thanks to solid pitching performances by Hansen and Trenton Beard. Once the Royals got healthy, they finished strong, winning their last four conference games to move from near the bottom of the conference all the way to second place. The best win of the season was against Janesville when eighth grade pitcher Hunter Purvis and also Beard and Banks provided a stellar effort on the mound. Drew Banks struck out back to back batters with the bases loaded in the top of the 7th for the win. Spencer Hansen hit a big 2-run home run late in the game and Trenton Beard provided a walk-off double. GMG was the next conference game and it was a nail-biter. Drew Banks pitched 6 % gritty innings for the win and Trenton Beard came in for the save. Lucas Frohwein hit a 2-run home run in the top of the 7th to break a 3-3 tie. The Royals last win of the season was a workman-like 11-1 win over Dunkerton on senior night.

The Royals received four all-conference honors. Spencer Hansen (infield), Drew Banks (utility), and Lucas Frohwein (outfield) were all selected first team all conference while veteran catcher Kaleb Gray was honorable mention. Spencer Hansen was selected 2nd team IBCA All District Pitcher as well. The team awards included Spencer Hansen and Drew Banks sharing Pitcher of the Year, Spencer Hansen offensive MVP, Breckin Clatt Defensive MVP, Trenton Beard Most Improved, and Colten Niemeyer JV MVP. The coaches award went to Trenton Beard.

The Royals set many individual records and one team record. Spencer Hansen became the new career wins (20), doubles (33), hits (123), RBIs (84), and assists (163) leader. Kaleb Gray became the new career fielding percentage (0.974) tie, thrown out stealing (32), putouts (662), and total chances (755) leader. Clay Gilmore set the new single season HBP record with 14 as well as the team setting the record for 38 hit by pitches in a season.

The Royals will miss the senior class of Asher Grover, Jamen Cochran, Clay Gilmore, Kaleb Gray, and Spencer Hansen. They became one of the winningest senior classes in school history despite losing almost a half of a season due to Covid their freshman years. The senior class provided many memories including beating North Tama the first game of their 8th grade year for the first time in school history and then many times after that; pitching a no-hitter in districts their sophomore year, and beating Janesville for the first time in their high school careers near the end of their senior season.

## COLO-NESCO SOFTBALL 2023

The season kicked off at the end of May with twenty-one 8-12th graders out for high school softball and concluded the first week of July in the second round regional. Varsity girls ended the season 11-15 and JV ended with a 4-14-1 record. Varsity ended 2nd place in the lowa Star South Conference with a record of 8-7, and had the most wins since the 2018 season. We welcomed each group of CN rec softball teams to join us at a game to be announced with our varsity, which is always a highlight for the varsity girls. Another exciting night was our MDA night vs lowa Valley. We played in alternate green jerseys for awareness. Some exciting games included a come-frombehind win vs GMG and our win over BCLUW, each helping us to secure the second place finish. As the season progressed we improved on defense and our bats started to really come around. The senior class will be missed as leaders of the team. We look forward to moving into the off season and starting to prepare for next year!
